

Application for Entry, 2023 Van Isle 360 International Yacht Race June 3rd to June 17th, 2023

Welcome, and thank you for considering an application for the 2023 race. The Van Isle 360 International Yacht Race is the most challenging and grueling sailboat race in the Pacific North West taking place in some of the most remote, inaccessible and spectacularly beautiful areas of British Columbia. Boat and crew preparation is critical, repair facilities and chandleries are rare.

You can expect a wide range of conditions, light breezes to gale force winds. Warm sunny days, cold miserable wet days, and the days everyone hopes for, strong NW winds, sunny skies, and spinnaker sleigh rides on the outside of the island. Big wind and seas, pitch black nights with endless stars, fog, no wind, big swells, whales, Ocean Sunfish, strong current, breaking surf, beckoning lighthouses, Albatross. Puffins. Blue Sharks, and lush mountains.

Plans are for 9 legs in 2023, with no throw outs; after all, the goal is to race around the entire Island.

There is a notable change to the 2023 legs, the stop at MOWI Fish Farm in Chancellor Channel is no longer a possibility due to the uncertainty of the renewal of the fish farming licenses. At the time of writing, there is no port for the fleet to moor in. As such, we are planning on the fleet anchoring overnight in the Port Neville Inlet located near N 50.29.097 - W 126.05.295. As such, boats and crew entering the race shall be prepared to anchor for an overnight stop with **NO** access to shore facilities Changes to the traditional start / and finish lines in the vicinity of Tyee Point and Eden Point will be in the Sailing Instructions when available in 2023.

When asked, what are the key items to consider for the race, it inevitably comes down to three thoughts.

- 1. Crew Dynamics 14 days of non-stop racing, little sleep, celebrations and the renewal or establishment of life time friendships will take a toll.
- 2. Organization and preparation of sleeping accommodations and meals booking your accommodations or planning sleeping quarters should happen as soon as you have received confirmation of acceptance of your entry. Meal plans: where and who will purchase supplies should be sorted. Ensuring safety requirements: equipment, crew with Offshore Personal Survival (Safety at Sea) Training certificates, first aid etc. per the Notice of Race are sorted well ahead of time.
- **3.** Boat preparation. If you think it requires replacement or repair, do it. Consider your safety gear carefully. Equipment failure is common, and access to parts or repair facilities is limited.

We are busy working with the 8 host communities/facilities, and the information on the various port activities will be available in early 2023. This information will then be sent to each skipper, road crew manager and of course posted on the website. A planning guide is in the works and will be available in late 2022.

We are pleased to announce that Suzanne Travis has agreed to take on the role of Road Crew mentor for the race. In addition, Steve Travis and Steve Johnson have offered to provide mentoring for any boats from the Seattle area entering for the first time. Details will be announced after applications have been accepted.

Waiver

Skipper/Owners Responsibility: The safety of a yacht and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper and owner who must do their best to ensure that the yacht is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy, and manned by an experienced and capable crew who are physically fit and able to face bad weather. They must be satisfied with the soundness of the hull, spars, rigging, sails, and all gear. They must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed, that the crew knows where the equipment is kept and how it is to be used.

Waiver and Release: I/we have read the Notice of Race issued for the Van Isle 360 International Yacht Race and agree to be bound by the rules and regulations therein, in the Sailing Instructions or in any Addenda or Amendments to either document. In consideration of acceptance of my/our race entry, and my crew members and I being permitted to take part in the race, I/we agree to save hold??harmless and indemnify Blast Performance Sailing Inc., their organizers, directors, officers and their respective agents, officials, employees, servants and representatives from and against all claims, actions, costs, expenses, and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to a person or property, howsoever caused or occasioned by the negligence of the same bodies, or any of them, or their agents officials, servants or representatives. I further understand and agree that this Release is binding upon me, my heirs, executors, and assigns. I certify that the yacht described above carries third party insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 (Canadian) per occurrence and that the policy covers yacht-racing activities in the waters surrounding Vancouver Island.

The Skipper shall ensure that each crew member participating in the race, and on every leg of the race, has read a copy of the Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, this waiver and any Addenda or Amendments to any of these documents.

Each participant of the race acknowledges that yacht racing is an inherently dangerous sport and that there is always the risk of personal injury, death, and property damage. Each participant of the race acknowledges that they are participating in the race voluntarily. Each participant agrees that this agreement shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of British Columbia, and that the Courts of British Columbia shall have exclusive jurisdiction over this agreement.
